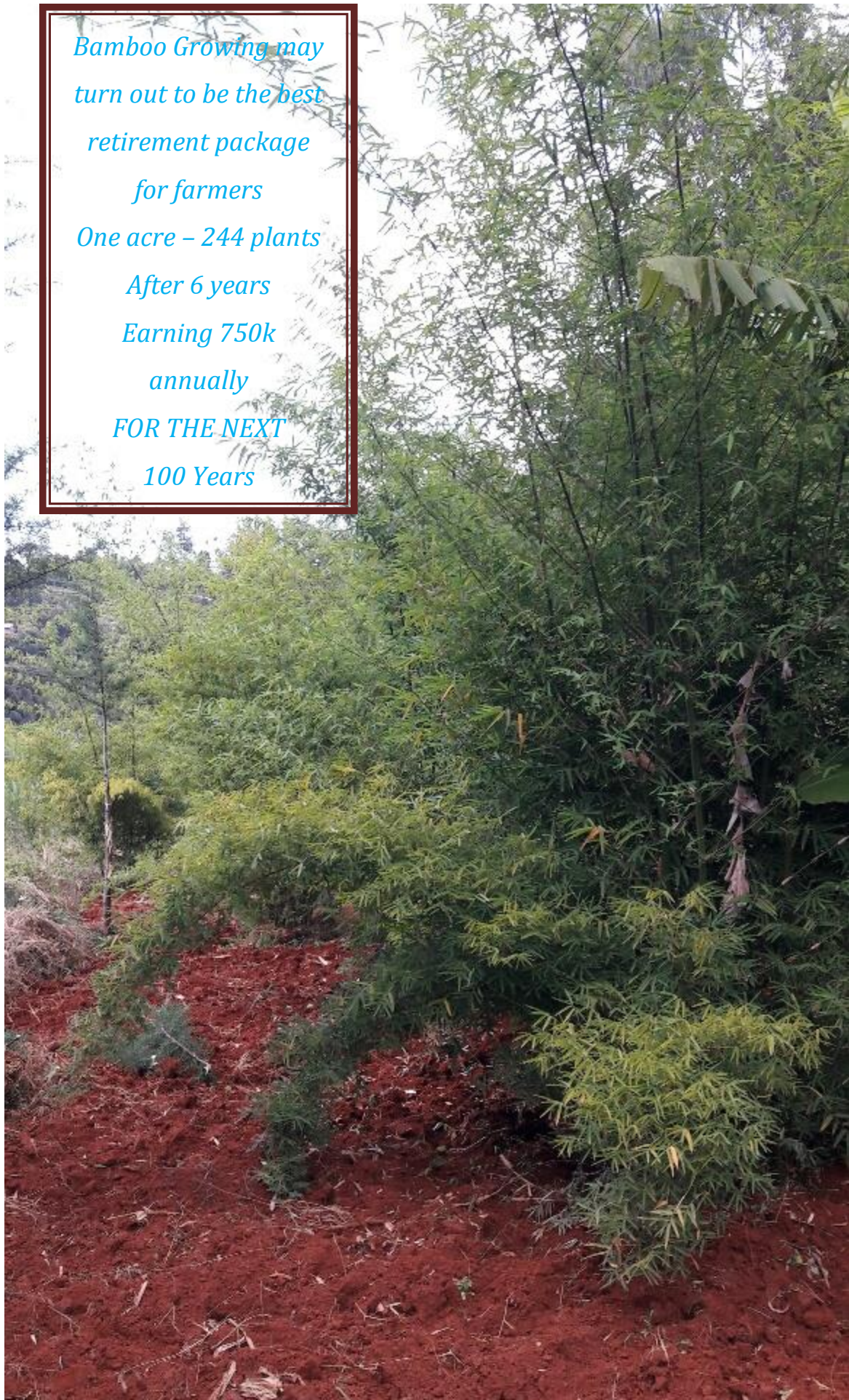

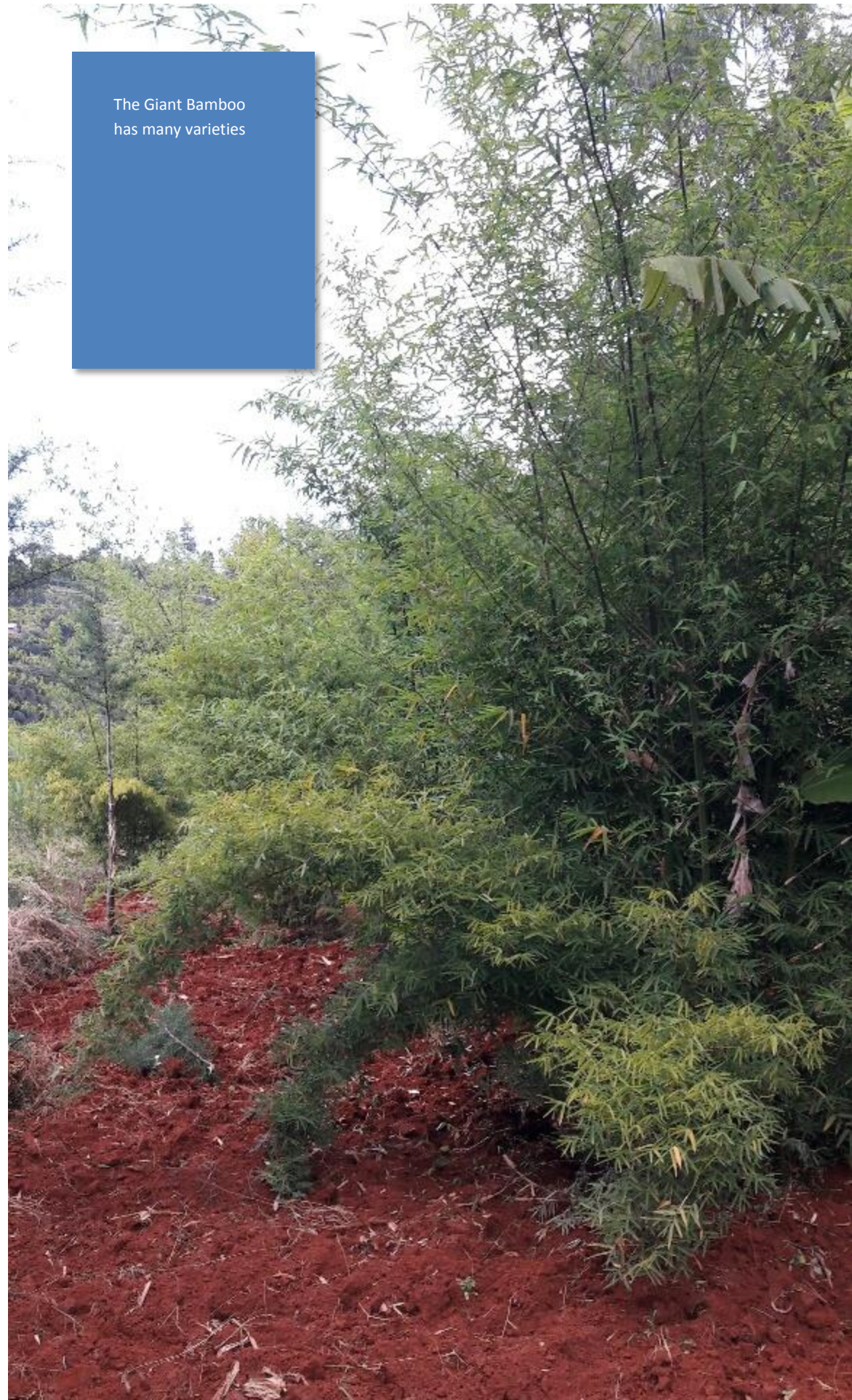

Tabitha Meka – Ndiani (Nyaani) is one of the eight most daring farmers, hoping Bamboo growing can generate the most needed economic gain.

The other seven farmers located in various areas:

Muoki – Musyamoni Village – Kilome Sub County; Kamoli – Nunguni Market (Kithembe) Kaiti Sub County; Kavithi Ithemboni, Kaiti Sub county; Kyalo Ndiani Kaiti Sub county, Njeru, Meru County all have reported positive reports on the bamboo they planted.



Apiculture is a very important component in the care of the creation. If plants must continue to grow and multiply, they need bees to pollinate.

Bees will supply natural honey and stored the longer it takes, the better it becomes. Honey is our Traditional means of preserving meat and other perishables.

Across the valley is a forest that also belongs to My Laudato Si home. The rest looks like my home in 1982.

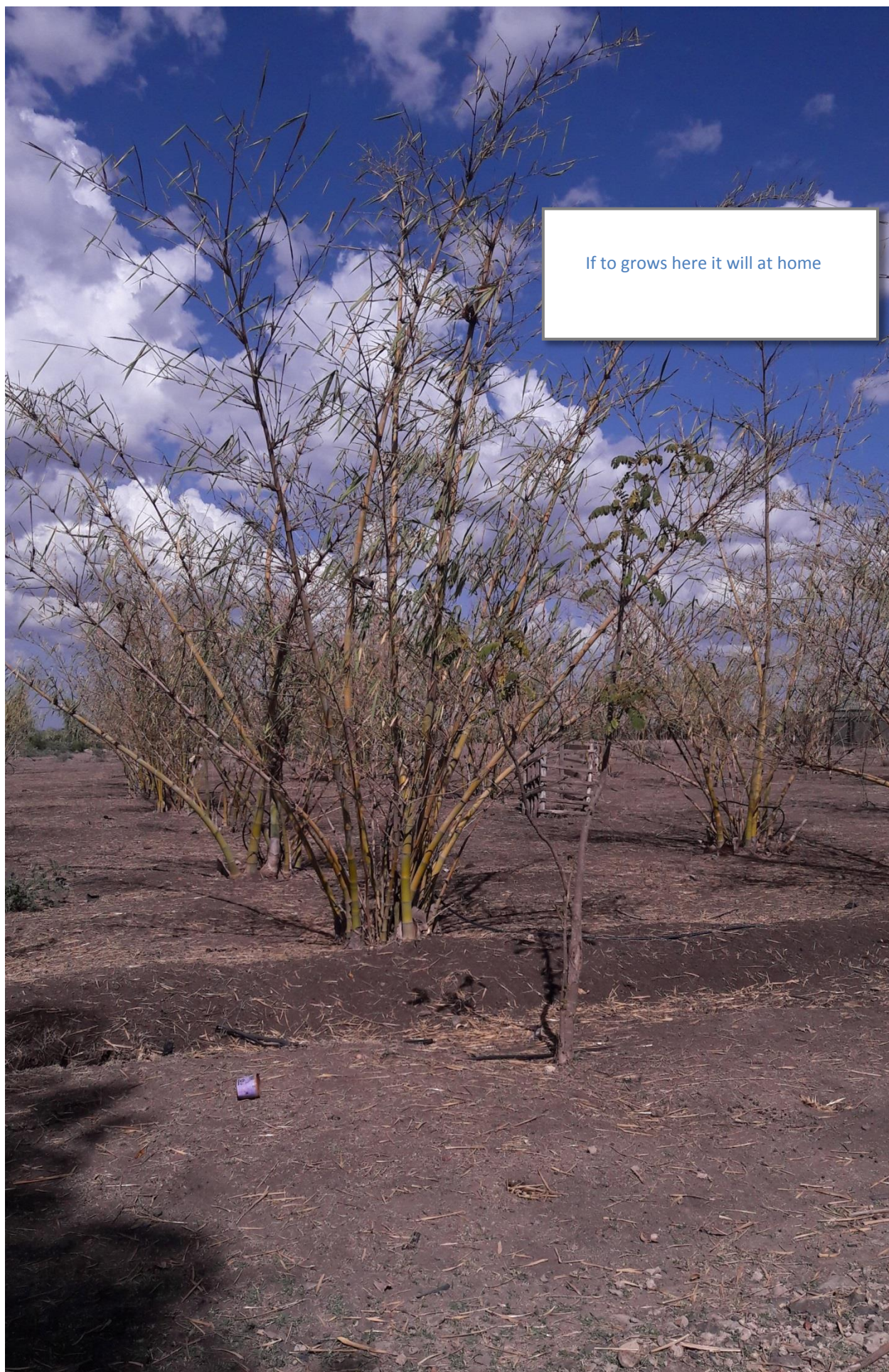
