Every beekeeper is worried. The use of insecticides on vegetables and farm trees is killing bees.


Everyone needs to know without bees humanity can survive for four years then perish. The world will be one huge desert.

























2017 Decent Living Institute of Organic Farming sponsored 7 famers to Kitil farm to learn about Bamboo growing.
